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Mini-Blocks Used:

"Tri-Squares"

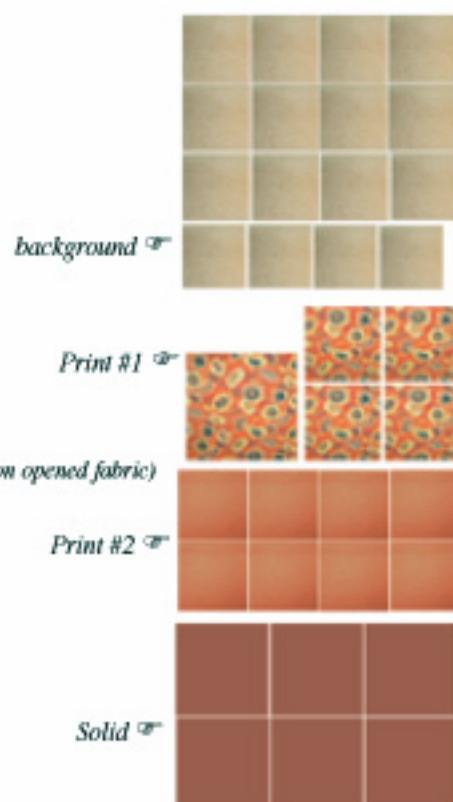

MATERIALS NEEDED

Print #1	(for center square & "faces")	½ Yard	(18 inches)
Solid color	(for "ears" & center)	⅔ Yard	(24 inches)
Background	(light colored print or solid)	1 ½ Yard	(40 ½ inches)
Print #2	(for chevrons)	2/3 Yard	(24 inches)
Backing		2 yards	(72 inches)
Thread to match		1	300 yard spool
If you want a border for this quilt		2 yards	
Batting	enough to cover finished quilt	up to 60" x 60"	



CUTTING &

(Demonstration purposes only, diagrams shown on opened fabric)

SEWING INSTRUCTIONS

All the Square blocks:

Cut 4	Background	8 ½" squares
Cut 4	Print #1	8 ½" squares

CUTTING & SEWING INSTRUCTIONS (CONT.)

All the Triangle-Squares:

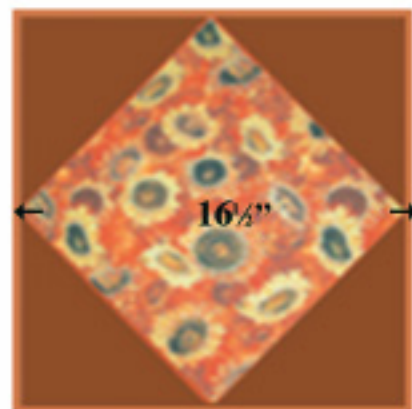
Cut 12	Background	9" squares
Cut 4	Solid	9" squares
Cut 8	Print #2	9" Squares

Refer to page 12 for Tri-Squares. Place one background upon one solid square (right sides together) and with a ruler and a *Mark-B-Gone™* pen draw diagonal lines for sewing lines. Do the same for the remaining background squares pairing them with the Print #2 squares. Sew each set of squares following the seam lines, then using the ruler make a cut diagonally between the seams. Press each "triangle", pressing seam toward darkest color. Trim to 16 1/2" square, if needed.

Center Square-in-a-Square block: (see page 11)

Cut 1	Print #1	11 3/4" Square	for center square
Cut 2	Solid	9" Squares	to be cut diagonally for 4 triangles

Sew two triangles to center squares opposite sides, press seams toward center square. Repeat the sewing with the remaining triangles and press. At this time you will trim this square with 1/4-inch seam allowances.



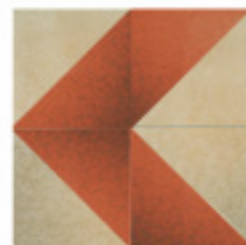
Mini-Blocks Assembly Instructions

To make the "Chevrons" you will need four Tri-Squares (background and Print #2). Refer to the instructions on page 13 to sew the "flying geese" mini-block. Make four "Chevron" blocks.



Go to page 14 to read how to make the Cat's Head block. These cat's heads are made of one Background square, one Print #2 square and two Background and Solid Tri-Squares. Make four "Cat's Head" blocks.

All the finished blocks (Chevrons and Cat's Heads) should be 16 1/2" square.



Assembling the "Block" Quilt

(see illustration on next page)

This quilt will be assembled in three rows. First row will consist of two "Cat's Head" and one "Chevron". The second row consists of two "Chevrons" and the Center Square. The third row is the same as the first row, but flipped over.

For the first row:

Sew a "Cat's Head" in each side of the "Chevron" to make the first row. Press to the corner blocks.

For the middle row:

Use two "Chevrons" and attach them on each side of the Center Square.

For the third row:

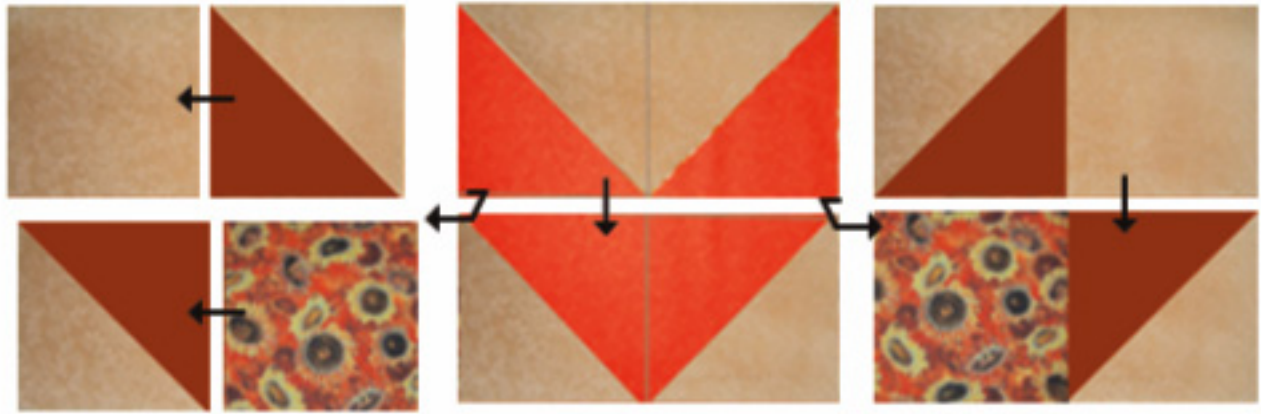
Follow the instructions for row one. When you assemble it, the "Chevron" will have the background "V" pointing up.

Finishing the quilt top: Sew all the rows together matching seams carefully and press seams towards the Center Row.

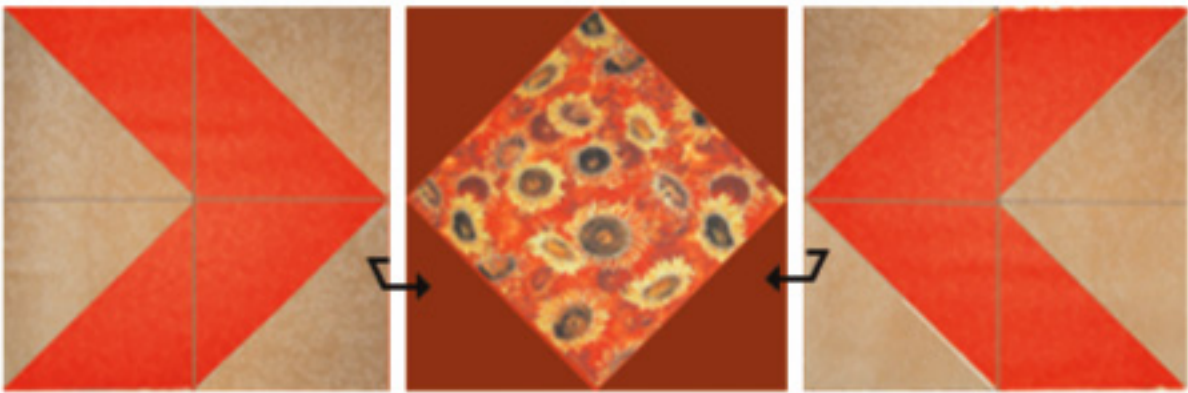
Now you are ready to put the batting and back on. Then it can be tied, hand quilted or machine quilted.
